



## ~~ Ice Rules ~~

- ☛ All skaters must be paid members to skate on club ice. Sign in and present your punch card or payment to the ice monitor prior to entering the ice.
- ☛ Only figure skates are allowed on club ice.
- ☛ Enter ice through the main gate.
- ☛ Videotaping from the main gate and parental coaching from the wall is prohibited.
- ☛ No food, drink (except water), or gum on the ice. Water bottles and other personal items must be kept behind the boards.
- ☛ Be courteous to other skaters and share the ice fairly. Lower level skaters should yield the right-of-way to higher level skaters. The order of priority is as follows:
  1. Skaters performing their program to music played on the sound system.
  2. Skaters on lesson with a coach.
  3. Higher level skaters in accordance with USFS test level.
  4. Lower level skaters in accordance with USFS test level.
- ☛ Skate safely and responsibly. Stay aware of other skaters to avoid accidents.
- ☛ Learn to Recognize Patterns of Movement. Skaters often repeat a particular section of program, moves pattern, jump or spin approach, etc. You should learn to recognize these patterns and allow the skater room to complete them if at all possible.
- ☛ Music will be played in the order it was received. A coach with a skater on lesson may request to cut in line and play that skater's music out of order once during a session.
- ☛ Club ice should be used to take lessons and to practice advanced skating moves. Don't use skating time to stand and talk. Discussions must take place by the boards, not on center ice.
- ☛ Keep personal belongings neat and organized in the warming room and on the bleachers. Put extra items back in your skating bag and tuck it under the benches, in a locker, or elsewhere out of the way.
- ☛ Clean up trash and personal belongings when leaving.
- ☛ Violators of these rules will be penalized. The ice monitor or any Board member may enforce these rules in an appropriate manner, and may deal with any skater who refuses to observe them, including by ejecting them from the skating session.
